



Since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him. Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ... When he has done this, then the Son himself will be made subject to him who put everything under him, so that God may be all in all. – 1 Corinthains 15:21-24,28

This month, with confident joy, we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. Our Easter celebration marks the center of our faith and the pinnacle of God's gracious activity in history. Here, in our Easter celebration, we see God fulfilling his promise to 'work all things together for our good.' (Cf. Romans 8:28) Here we see our gracious God overcoming 'sin, death, and the power of the devil.' (Luther: Explanation of the Second Article of the Apostles Creed) Truly the center of history and the substance of our faith.

Paul, in our reading above, succinctly lays out for us exactly what God is doing in Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

Paul begins with our harsh reality. There's no sugar coating in his words as he lays out for us the reality of our falleness. Paul writes, 'death came through a man ...in Adam all die.' (v21-22) This is our reality and it's not just temporal death. Our reality is our eternal separation from our loving God. (Cf. Colossians 1:21-22) Without God's intervention this would be all we would have to look forward to. Hopeless, desperate, bleak, and pathetic. But this is NOT what God desires and it is NOT where God leaves us. Rather God seeks us out. (Cf. Genesis 3:8-9) God promises to redeem us. (Cf. Genesis 3:15 & John 3:16-17) And God acts in time and history to fulfill his promise. (Cf. Romans 6:23 & Galatians 3:13)

Knowing this, Paul, in the passage above, quickly transitions to the Gospel, the good news of God, saying: 'Since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.' (v21-22) This is God's love in action. This is how God deals with our problem. This is our hope. Here we see our holy yet compassionate God remaining true to his nature, just and the one who justifies, (Cf. Romans 3:25-26) meeting us in the place of our deepest need. God so love us that he sent his Son, not to condemn but to redeem and save us. (Cf. John 3:16-17) Again, this is the substance of God's grace. This is our hope. This is our Easter celebration. (Cf. Colossians 1:21-22) Let us rejoice in this good ness of God!

Paul then reminds us that the final step of God's plan of Redemption is still to come. Paul continues: 'The end will come, when [Jesus] hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ... When he has done this, then the Son himself will be made subject to him who put everything under him, so that God may be all in all.' (v24,28) In the end, and as a result of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God's original will, purpose, and plan will be restored, and we will dwell in the presence of God forever! (Cf. Revelation 21:1-5; Revelation 22:1-5) Here at Easter, in awe, we see and rejoice in God's great love for us. Blessed Easter!




As the one lone ember's flame diminished, there was a momentary glow and then its fire was no more. Soon it was cold and "dead as a doornail."

Why is a Christian education so important? Why pay for school when you can get it for free?


