Watch for more information, and please plan to join us for this special time of fellowship and celebration!



The LORD himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. (which means: 'God with us') – Isaiah 7:14

It's hard to believe but we are drawing near to the end of another year. With this comes our yearly observance of Advent and our celebration of Christmas. Here in the darkest days of the year our attention is drawn to the faithfulness of our God as we celebrate the fulfillment of his promise to redeem and save.

Through the prophet Isaiah God speaks to his Old Testament people. He calls out their unfaithfulness and challenges their desire to establish alliances with pagan nations. His warnings, though, go unheeded with devastating consequences. Still God remains faithful making multiple promises of their restoration and of the coming of the Messiah. Indeed, God promises that he will 'astound his people with wonder upon wonder.' (Cf. Isaiah 29:13-16) Our text above is one of those amazing promises that God provides and is the essence of both our Advent observance and our Christmas celebration.

Indeed, wonder upon wonder and beyond our comprehension, God promises to redeem, and restore his people! Isaiah writes: "The LORD himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel, which means: 'God with us'" (Isaiah 7:14) This restoration will be accomplished by God himself! God will come among us and redeem us from our rebellion. (Cf. Galatians 4:4-7)

In Advent, with humility, we acknowledge OUR 'need' and we prepare OUR hearts to celebrate God's fulfillment of his promise in Christ Jesus. We remind ourselves of our 'humble state' and, with the Psalmist, ask: 'what is man that you are mindful of him, humanity that you care for them?' (Psalm 8:4) Indeed, our hope and confidence flow from this: God is faithful! (Cf. 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24)

In this way, our Advent observance frames our Christmas celebration and prepares us for it. At Christmas we rejoice in the faithfulness of God, and we join with the angel chorus proclaiming: 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.' (Luke 2:14) God has stepped down into our darkness in Christ Jesus and, through his life, death, and resurrection, has redeemed us from our sin, death, and the power of the devil.' (Luther: Explanation of the Second Article of the Apostles Creed) Indeed, hope in the midst of darkness. As Paul writes: 'God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ.' (Cf. 2 Corinthians 4:6)

With humility, we rejoice in the goodness of God!



Many years ago I read (what I found to be for me) a very special Christmas story in *Guideposts* magazine. I believe the author, a pastor, said it took place in the 1950's. He was the chaplain for a boys' boarding school, and the pastor of the congregation that worshipped in the chapel there.

Most of the boys from this school went home for the Christmas break. However, there were a few boys who could not, for whatever reasons. The staff tried hard to make the holiday special for those boys.

One Christmas Eve, one of the young boys (6-7 years old) who couldn't go home crawled under his cot in the barracks-style dormitory and refused to come out. The staff did everything they could think of to get him to come out, and when nothing worked, they did what good Christian staff do: they gave the problem to the pastor.

Now, the pastor was not having a great day. He was still, this late in the day, struggling to write his Christmas Eve sermon, and had not even found his focus for the sermon, which he had to deliver in a few short hours. The stubborn little boy was not a welcome intrusion! But he dutifully climbed the stairs to the dorm room, located the correct bed, and went to stand beside it. In his best pulpit voice, he basically commanded the boy to come out and join everyone for dinner. In the long silence that followed, he told the air above the bed how the staff had worked hard to make this nice Christmas Eve dinner, how much the boy was sure to enjoy it, and the festivities planned, and how he needed to come out and join everyone. There was no response, so he tried talking about the beautiful Christmas tree, and the gift under it with the little boy's name on it. Nothing. He continued with thoughts about playing with the other boys, etc., etc.

Finally, not knowing what else to do, he got down on his hands and knees, and peered under the bed. From the far side of the bed, two sad little eyes stared into his own. After gazing at each other for a bit, the pastor laid down, and continued just looking at the little boy, not saying anything. Then, he slowly stretched his hand toward the boy, and the boy took it.


Finally, after laying this way for while, they both got up. The pastor was no longer frustrated. God had given him his sermon.

God came to us at our level, as one of us, to save us.




