

During those years, she completed her Bachelor's degree at Concordia University Irvine, was colloquized, and completed her Master's in Education through Concordia University Portland.



### **Jesus Confirming Peter's Faith**

[Jesus] said to [Simon Peter] a third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." – John 21:17

This year, our Easter celebration continues through the entire month of May. The Gospel reading for the first Sunday in May is the account of Jesus reaffirming Peter after he had denied Jesus three times on Good Friday morning. (John 18:15-27) As we read the account (John 21:15-17) we can feel Peter's pain as Jesus asks him three times, 'Peter, do you love me?' At first hearing of this passage we may think that Jesus' actions are uncaring, but the opposite is true. Jesus here is not questioning Peter's loyalty, commitment, or even his faith. Rather here Jesus is meeting Peter in the place of his greatest pain and his greatest need. Here, in gracious mercy, we see Jesus reaffirming Peter and inviting him to lay down his doubts and fears.

This passage speaks of God's compassion, understanding and grace, not just to Peter but to all of us. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, (John 10:1-16) knows his sheep. He seeks them out when they get lost and rejoices when he finds them. (Cf. Luke 15:1-7) This is the essence of the Gospel. (Cf. Isaiah 53:4-6) Jesus has come to seek and save that which is lost. (Cf. Luke 19:9-10) We, like Peter, need this reassurance of God's grace every day.

The first Sunday of May is also Confirmation Sunday. This year five young people will stand before the congregation and acknowledge their faith. We rejoice with them as they make 'their good confession' (Cf. 1 Timothy 6:11-12) and we join our voices with theirs acknowledging our loving God and holding onto his promise: 'I am with you always, to the very end of the age.' (Matthew 28:20)

Why attend church? Many believe we don't have to "go to church" to worship God. We can watch the live stream, hear Pastor's sermon, who needs our prayers for this week, sing along with the hymn/song lyrics posted on the screen, and basically "participate" in our pjs from the comfort of home...much easier when we're extra tired, we've overslept and would have to really hurry to make it on time, more comfortable when the weather is bad or when we don't feel like talking to anyone anyway...

But is "going to church" really only about hearing the sermon? About knowing who to pray for or even about singing? Can we really worship God alone?

And let us take thought of how to spur one another on to love and good works, not abandoning our own meetings, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging each other, and even more so because you see the day drawing near. Hebrews 10:24-25 / New English Translation / emphasis added

The Lord apparently wants us to understand that "going to church" *is* about more. The Hebrews passage above says being together with His family is important—very important. It is how we encourage each other—we don't just attend for ourselves, but to encourage others as well as ourselves. And *we* need to be encouraged and supported in our life with Jesus, or we can easily drift in our focus and discipleship. Jesus uses our family of faith—our church family—to do that (no matter how unfaithful and hypocritical we see ourselves and others to be).

We come together as family—the family of God—to build relationships as the family of God. We come together to remind each other and agree together about the greatness of God, the trustworthiness of God, the love of God. We come together to encourage each other—even if only by our very presence. We come together because being together matters a great deal, and our absence in the togetherness is a loss to everyone, not just ourselves.

Worship includes the reception of the means of grace—*hearing* the Word of God in Scripture and *participating* in the sacraments—but also describes our response to this power of God brought to our life by the Spirit, desiring to receive forgiveness, grace, and righteousness. If *being at* a concert or football game is much more than just hearing the music or watching the action, how much more *being at* church is than just hearing and watching it on TV?

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:24-25 / New International Version / emphasis added

Jesus longs to gather us together with himself (see Matthew 23:37), and He promises "...where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." Matthew 18:20 / New International Version / emphasis added

May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 15:5-6)

### **Last Day of School Service**


