

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

—Philippians 4:6-8

Blessed November! This month, as we do every year, we pause our hectic lives and remember the goodness of God. Our observance of Thanksgiving Day presents us with a perfect opportunity to refocus our priorities and to reorientate our perspectives on life. Indeed, God is good, he knows us and cares for us, and he promises to work all things together for our good. (Cf. Romans 8:28)

Still, this is easier said than done. Paul, in the reading above, both acknowledges this common struggle and encourages us to strive to trust God. Paul begins by urging us to lay our real-world anxiousness aside, putting it into the hands of God. Paul writes: 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.' (v6) Here Paul indicates that the answer to 'anxiousness' is thanksgiving, that is a heart that remembers that God is the one provides for all our needs. As Paul says elsewhere: '[It is God who] gives everyone life and breath and everything else. (Cf. Acts 17:24-27) A thankful heart puts everything into perspective. (Cf. Matthw 6:25-34; Luke 12:22-31) And even if, and when, the worst happens we know, from experience, that we can trust him. As the David writes: 'God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging.' (Psalm 46:1-3)

Paul continues saying that as we do this, as we place our trust and confidence in God, God himself will bless us his peace. Paul points to this blessed result when he writes: 'And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.' (v7) This peace of God is deep and abiding and it 'transcends' our fallen exceptions. Still, for the people of God, this is God's promised reality. As Jesus said in one of our Gospel readings in October, 'With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible with God.' (Mark 10:27)

Paul concludes by sharing his 'recipe' for fighting this real-world battle writing: 'Finally, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable, if anything is excellent or praiseworthy, focus on these things.' (v8) This, I suggest, is where our Thanksgiving celebration comes in. Again, at Thanksgiving we turn our hearts toward God and we remind ourselves of his goodness, we 'refocus our priorities and we reorientate our perspectives on life' (above). We turn to God with thanksgiving. (v6)



Seven years ago we celebrated the 35th anniversary of Zion Lutheran School. Many former students came home to Zion to celebrate with us, and several who couldn't come made videos to share during the service. Hundreds of names were posted and a huge number 35 with hundreds of pictures in it reminded us of all the students—and families of students—we had touched in those 35 years. Students and families who experienced the grace and mercy of God through Christ in their life every day at school, because life—all parts of life—is lived in God's love at this school. Not perfectly, of course, but none-the-less, lived in the love of God. What a blessing to see some of the fruits of our ministry!

Zion Lutheran School is our church's mission. We have the blessed opportunity to participate in our mission in several ways. First, pray for our school, the children and their teachers! Along with praying for the school as a whole, please pick up a class list and commit to pray for each child and teacher in the class every day. What a difference those few minutes of your time will make in those lives! Also consider celebrating their learning and achievements with them occasionally by attending one of their programs or chapel (9:15 on Wednesdays in the church). They will experience God's love in our caring presence.

Chapel is only 15-20 minutes and immediately after there is a prayer meeting—where two or three are gathered together in His name—to pray together for our school. We're done by 10.

Finally, please prayerfully consider giving \$25 (or more) a month in support of our school mission. Give25 cards are available in the narthex so you can keep track of your giving.

We as God's people have been given many vocations—husband/wife, parent, son/daughter, position of employment, friend, homemaker, position of volunteer activities... and missionary: [Jesus said,] "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." $(John\ 20:21)$

[Jesus' parting words to His followers,] "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:80

The Power of a Simple Gift






