Families are praying together. Last Sunday, many husbands led their family in prayer and Scripture reading before tuning into their church's livestream sermon. James 1:5 tells us that if any of us lacks wisdom, we should ask GOD. As we read and study our Bibles to gain more knowledge of GOD/HIS character/HIS will, we at the same time ask GOD for wisdom to apply HIS Word to our lives in order to live/love/trust/obey HIM to the glory of HIS name and the accomplishment of HIS purposes.

Let's all turn off the news for a few hours each day and spend time alone with THE One and Only Infinite, Omniscient GOD of the Universe. Seek <u>HIM</u> in HIS Word. Seek <u>HIM</u> in prayer. Pray that the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea (Habakkuk 2:14). By GOD's grace, as HIS people, **let's use this time of testing to develop a deeper intimacy with our LORD** wherein our trust and confidence in HIM grows deep and HIS Divine purposes are accomplished among us... that HE weaves into our souls *a right understanding* and *a right response* to the times in which we live.
