Having personally experienced being broken, disappointments and wounded from childhood to marriage to her late 30's, Karen is very much aware of how easy it is to appear OK, but yet be secretly hurting. Through the power of God's Word, Karen received healing and her earnest compassion is to bring hope, healing and rejuvenation to women who are emotionally wounded.

What services does DZEC provide?

- 7 step program to wholeness and freedom
- One on one counseling through the Word of God
- Training center to empower and equip women to know that they too were created for destiny and that it is never too late to walk in their God-given purposes.
- Quarterly training seminars and workshops that will promote family enrichment, educational development and spiritual wholeness

What distinguishes DZEC from other similar organizations?

What makes us different is that we cater to the population that goes unnoticed. Many programs are catered to aid women who are physically bruised, substance abuse and homeless. But there are many who are the everyday, church-going, family-oriented, career-oriented, and nicely dressed who are secretly hurting. We minister to the core of the hurt through the Word of God. We empower and equip women to find their purpose and walk in it.
