### A Church that Serves: Foundation for Christian Service

*Service.* At the core of Christian love and neighborliness is *service*. We must serve as unto God; which is to say that our ministry to one other and to our neighbor, is how we serve the Lord. The best of who we are and hope to be is tied to our service.

To be a Christian is to pattern our lives after the model provided by Jesus. One of the lessons from the life of Christ is the primacy of service. The importance of service, however, is not limited to the New Testament. The very nature of human relationship with God is marked by service. This is God's design, Jesus' model, and humanity's duty.

This unit of our P.U.R.S.U.E. Excellence study series is on Service. Over three lessons, we will explore how service should impact and mark our lives. We will discuss the foundations, a model, and reasons of Christian service. Together, let's see how WFLCM can remain committed to, while increasing, our service to God and for others.

# Biblical theology for service

The Bible provides a solid foundation for constructing an understanding of Christian service. The following texts help us develop a Bible-based theology for service.

- Matthew 5:16 Service is a way for people to \_\_\_\_\_ God at work in the world and to recognize the need to glorify God.
- Matthew 20:28 Service \_\_\_\_\_ us from self-importance and \_\_\_\_\_ us with Jesus.

Here is what we might say concerning a biblical theology of service: Christian service is a means by which God receives glory through the exercise of faith, as such exercise is undertaken for God's glory and fulfillment of God's purposes in the world.



## Importance of service to God

It is easy to think of service as something done from one person to another. While that can certainly be the case, service to another person is not the only way to view service. A necessary aspect of service that we must not forget, is our service to God. Following are a few notes on the importance of service to God:

- **Deuteronomy 11:13-17** Service to God reveals God's \_\_\_\_\_ plan.
- John 12:25-26 Service to Christ, reveals how God \_\_\_\_\_\_ those who trust God.
