Hallmarks of a relevant church

The following hallmarks of a relevant church seem to be consistent with the biblical foundations and theological understanding of what makes a church relevant. (*Sources: Essential Church?: Reclaiming a Generation of Dropouts* and *Autopsy of a Deceased Church: 12 Ways to Keep Yours Alive.*)

- 1. Simplified structure
- 2. Deep content
- 3. Expects results based on faith *in* action
- 4. Multiplies disciples
- 5. Steeped in prayer
- 6. Meaningful member involvement
- 7. Mission-minded money management
- 8. Plans, specifically, to evangelize the community
- 9. Willing to change that leads to action
- 10. Partners with community
