

On Paul's Conversion and Calling

In Chapter 2, Paul continues to share the conversion story and calling to ministry. As a part of this personal narrative, Paul describes a meeting with the Jerusalem church (also see Acts 15) and another meeting with Peter and Paul. It is important to Paul to be clear that what he shares about the Gospel is shaped by Divine revelation.

What occurred in Jerusalem was taking place in Galatia. Thus, this narrative is an important historical link for believers in Galatia.



Responsibility for the Gospel (2:1-2)

- Paul was independent, but he was connected.
 - > He was called to the ministry of the Gospel apart from the other Apostles.
 - > His evangelistic missions functioned beyond the oversight of the Apostles.
 - > He shared his message to the Gentiles with the Apostles.
 - > He ensured his message aligned with that of the Apostles.

No matter how we engage in ministry, we are responsible for ensuring that we are accountable to one another as we exercise God's anointing.

Legacy of the Gospel (2:3-6)

- The Gospel informs faith and enables new life.
- The liberating message of the Gospel filters out errors that have the potential to enslave believers.
- Truth lives on (in you)!
- God's liberative grace is available to everyone.

The Gospel is Good News for everyone, no matter how we come to faith and no matter who tries to convince us otherwise.

Fellowship of the Gospel (2:7-10)

- One Gospel suffices for multiple contexts cultural, social, economic, etc.
- One Gospel empowers various callings.
- One Gospel promotes camaraderie and authority.
- One Gospel centers the practice of faith.

Where unity among believers exists, faith-informed productivity can be realized.
