Origin of Galatians

• Purpose

- \Box Reason for writing 1:6
- \Box Resolution 5:1

Background

Asia Minor – created by Augustus (25 BCE) as Provincia Galatia
Paul and Barnabas in Lystra and Derbe in Acts 14:1-23

• Timing

□ As early as 49 CE; or as late as 56 CE



Author of Galatians

• Paul's personal story

 \Box An apostle not from men nor through men (1:1).

- □ A direct recipient of the Gospel (1:12).
- □ A Jew and former persecutor of the church (1:13-14).
- □ Called by God in an act of predestination (1:15).
- Defender of the Gospel (Ch. 2).

Paul is the organizing pastor of the believers in Galatia and functions under apostolic authority.



Recipients of Galatians

Primarily Gentiles

- Ethnic Galatians (north)
- Residents of Rome's province (south)
- Distinctions in Acts 13-14 and Acts 16:6 and 18:23 lead to belief that the northern Celtic tribes were the audience for Paul's letter.

Already believers by the time of this letter

Struggling to discern the practical implications of the Gospel

Form of Galatians (cont'd.)

Because Galatians is a letter, it is best to read and study it as a letter. Keep in mind:

- Paul's intention
 - What does Paul want to communicate?
- Paul's passion
 - How are Paul's arguments shaped by how he feels about the need for this letter?
- Paul's proclamation
 - What does Paul say?
 - Why does Paul say it?
