The Outline of Justification (8:1-4)

- Def. □ the act of pronouncing righteous, acquittal.
- Upon conversion/salvation, one is moved from eternal condemnation to divine pardon.
- To be 'not guilty' is not the same as being 'innocent'.

The Opportunity of sanctification (8:5-11)

- Def. \square the process of making or becoming holy, set apart.
- Use of the believer being progressively transformed by the Lord into His likeness.
- Transformation does not occur overnight. It requires patience and perseverance.

The Outcome of Regeneration (8:12-17)

- Def □ a new birth, renewal
- A benefit for believers that comes by way of the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:5).
- A one-time event that is displayed over time through the believer's living, then manifested in time through the glory of Christ Jesus.
