



What's In A Name?


- In the Bible, a person's name is a description of his or her character
- God's name is equal to all that the Bible and creation tells us about God
 - "Hallowed be thy name" (Matthew 6:9), "Believe that He is" (Hebrews 11:6)
 - When we pray, we pray we will honor God and believe God in ways that accurately reflect God's character as revealed by God's name(s).
- The names of God tell us something that is true about God.
- God's names are revealed to us:
 - Anthromorphic Language speaks of God in human terms
 - Human experience
 - Truly and accurately
 - Connects to all other scripture
- "Anthromorphic language about God is true when it occurs in scripture, but it
 can be understood rightly only by continual reading (STUDY) of scripture
 throughout our lives in order to understand this language in the context of all
 scripture". (Wayne Grudem, Systematic Theology)



As we learn scripture, our eyes are opened (the blind can see) to see reflections of God in creation. (Life Experiences) In that we learn to see God and know God's names. Thus, get to know God as we see God.

In the traditional Jewish view, YHVH is the Name expressing the mercy and condescension of Almighty God:

"The Holy One, Blessed be He, said to those, You want to know my name? I am called according to my actions. When I judge the creatures I am Elohim, and when I have mercy with My world, I am named YHWH" (Exodus Rabbah 3:6).

Elohim (אלהים) is the Name given for God as the Creator of the universe (Gen 1:1) and implies strength, power, and justice. YHVH, on the other hand, expresses the idea of God's closeness to humans. For example, YHVH is first mentioned as the One who "breathed into his (Adam's) nostrils the breath of life" (Genesis 2:7).

What is this authority? It is delegated power

How do we know we have this authority? The Scripture tells us of our position in Christ.

- The same power that raised Jesus Christ from the dead, raised up the believer, the children of God from death to life we are a new creation. He set Jesus in the place of honor He set Jesus on his throne on His right hand the right hand of the throne of God is the center of power of the whole universe.
- We were dead in sin in the spirit of bondage to sin. But, when we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, we are no longer held in the spirit of bondage to sin, we have the spirit of adoption. We have become members of the family of God the Father, heirs and joint heirs with Christ.
- We are seated with Christ, in Him, on the throne with power and authority.
 - First John 4:4says, "You are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world."
 - "He that is in the world" is Satan, the god of this world and the head of Principalities, powers, and rulers of the darkness of this world.
- The power that backs our authority is greater than that which backs our enemies.
 - The Holy Spirit says power on earth is invested in the name of Jesus Christ and obtained by Him through his overcoming the enemy and it belongs to the Church. Therefore, we should exercise that authority, for it belongs to us on the earth, and in this life, we shall reign by Christ Jesus.

Authority belongs to us whether we realize it or not. But just knowing this isn't enough. It's knowledge that is acted upon that brings the results.

It's a tragedy for Christians to go through life and never find out what belongs to them.

Faith

We believe what God has already spoken about believers/saints through the apostle Paul under guidance of the Holy Spirit.

"Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God, but made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men. And being found in fashion as a man. He humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross, That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

God seated Jesus at his right hand in the heavenly places far above all principalities and powers, far above evil, far above every circumstance that has a name. Go down Covers the good news for us personally. And has put all things under his feet and given him to be the head over all things to the church, which is his body.

Ephesians 1:22-23 22 And He put all *things* under His feet, and gave Him *to be* head over all *things* to the church, 23 which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.

Now that we are His body, we are seated far above every name that is named in this world, even the lowest members in the body of Christ, the feet are above every demonic power and evil circumstance in existence.

Ephesians 2:6 6 and raised *us* up together, and made *us* sit together in the heavenly *places* in Christ Jesus,

Ephesians 2:6 confirms this fact. We have been raised up together and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus.

The following prayers of the Apostle Paul in his letter to the church at Ephesus are made personal by adding personal pronouns for you and me. Read these two Pauline prayers twice a day and grow in them in your spirit in belief, acceptance, and thankfulness through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer #1 - Ephesians 1:17-21

[I pray] that the God of my Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to me the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of my understanding being enlightened; that I may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward me, who believes according to the working of His mighty power, which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age, but also in that which is to come.

Prayer #2 - Ephesians 3:14-19



POWER IN THE NAME OF GOD

God has always shown us God's power in the name of God for God is faithful. God Almighty would do something demonstrating sovereign and miraculous power when called upon in God's name. The Hebrew name for God is YHWH which we have translated in English to be Yahweh and Jehovah. God's name "I AM" has the power to be whatever we need God to be. You will find the name Jehovah attached to a title declaring what God has the power to be: provider, healer, leader, peace, protector and other things.

The power of God's name is also revealed in the name of Jesus. The name means "Yahweh saves" or "Yahweh is salvation." When it is transliterated from Hebrew and Aramaic, the name is Yeshua. This word is a combination of Ya, an abbreviation for Yahweh, and the verb yasha, meaning "rescue," "deliver," or "save." The English spelling of the Hebrew Yeshua is Joshua. But when translated from Hebrew into Koine Greek, the original language of the New Testament, the name Yeshua becomes lēsous. In English, lēsous becomes Jesus. It is the only name which has the power to give us salvation. Bless our loving God for the power of God's wonder-full name!





Old Testament

- Inward peace was the portion of the righteous who trusted in God

New Testament

- The gospel in Christ is a message of peace from God to men (Romans 5:1)
- It is to be cherished and followed by Christians. (Mark 9:50)
- God is therefore "the God of peace," the Author and Giver of all good ("peace" including every blessing) very frequently. (Romans 15:33)
- We have also "peace" as a greeting (Matthew 10:13)
- The peace that Christ brought is primarily spiritual peace from and with God, peace in the heart, peace as the disposition or spirit. He said that He did not come "to send peace on the earth, but a sword," referring to the searching nature of His call and the divisions and clearances it would create. But, of course, the spirit of the gospel and of the Christian is one of peace, and it is a Christian duty to seek to bring war and strife everywhere to an end. This is represented as the ultimate result of the gospel and Spirit of Christ; universal and permanent peace can come only as that Spirit rules in men's hearts. (Matthew 10:34)



The Holy Spirit The active indwelling presence of God, enabling believers to live out faith, grow spiritually, and fulfill God's purposes.

Conviction of Sin and Righteousness: The Holy Spirit's initial work often involves bringing conviction of sin to individuals, revealing their need for God's salvation. He also convicts the world of righteousness (showing what is right and just according to God's standards)

- Regeneration and New Birth: For those who respond to God's call, the Holy Spirit is the agent of new birth or regeneration. Indwelling and Sealing: When someone becomes a believer, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell permanently within them (1 Corinthians
- 6:19). He also "seals" believers, signifying their ownership by God and guaranteeing their future inheritance in Christ (Ephesians 1:13-14). Empowerment for Witness and Service: The Holy Spirit empowers believers to be witnesses for Christ, giving them boldness and the ability to share the Gospel effectively (Acts 1:8). He also gifts believers with spiritual abilities for service within the church and to the world
- Guidance and Teaching: The Holy Spirit guides believers into all truth, helping them understand God's Word and apply it to their lives (John 16:13). He also teaches them, reminding them of Christ's words and bringing spiritual revelation.
- Sanctification: The Holy Spirit is actively involved in the process of sanctification, which is the ongoing work of making believers more like Christ; holy, set apart and consecrated to God's service. He enables them to overcome sin, develop godly character, and live lives that honor God (Galatians 5:22-23 - the "fruit of the Spirit").
- Intercession: The Holy Spirit intercedes for believers, praying on their behalf according to God's will, especially when they don't know
- what to pray for (Romans 8:26-27).
- Comfort and Assurance: He is often referred to as the "Comforter" or "Counselor" (John 14:16). He provides comfort in times of trouble,
- sorrow, and difficulty. He also gives assurance of salvation, confirming to believers that they are children of God (Romans 8:16).
- Unity and Fellowship: The Holy Spirit promotes unity among believers, bringing them together as one body in Christ (Ephesians 4:3). He also fosters fellowship and a sense of community within the church.

The Names of God and Their Importance

In Biblical times, names carried great weight, because they not only revealed a person's character but were often prophetic as well. Throughout the pages of Scripture, God is called by many names, each expressing a truth about His nature or a promise to His people. The first name God used for Himself is in Genesis 17:1, when He said to Abram, "I am God Almighty" (El Shaddai).

The more we learn more about God's names, our relationship with Him is:

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to him and said, "I am El-Shaddai — 'God Almighty.' Serve me faithfully and live a blameless life. ²I will make a covenant with you, by which I will guarantee to give you countless descendants."

³ At this, Abram fell face down on the ground. Then God said to him, ⁴ "This is my covenant with you: I will make you the father of a multitude of nations! ⁵ What's more, I am changing your name. It will no longer be Abram. Instead, you will be called Abraham, for you will be the father of many nations. ⁶ I will make you extremely fruitful. Your descendants will become many nations, and kings will be among them!

⁷"I will confirm my covenant with you and your descendants after you, from generation to generation. This is the everlasting covenant: I will always be your God and the God of your descendants after you. ⁸ And I will give the entire land of Canaan, where you now live as a foreigner, to you and your descendants. It will be their possession forever, and I will be their God."

Abram means "exalted father"; **Abraham** sounds like a Hebrew term that means "father of many."

Jehovah – Nissi – nis-SEE - "The Lord is my Banner" - Ex. 17:15-16 Exodus 17:10-16

¹⁰ So Joshua did what Moses had commanded and fought the army of Amalek. Meanwhile, Moses, Aaron, and Hur climbed to the top of a nearby hill. ¹¹ As long as Moses held up the staff in his hand, the Israelites had the advantage. But whenever he dropped his hand, the Amalekites gained the advantage. ¹² Moses' arms soon became so tired he could no longer hold them up. So Aaron and Hur found a stone for him to sit on. Then they stood on each side of Moses, holding up his hands. So his hands held steady until sunset. ¹³ As a result, Joshua overwhelmed the army of Amalek in battle.

¹⁴After the victory, the Lord instructed Moses, "Write this down on a scroll as a permanent reminder, and read it aloud to Joshua: I will erase the memory of Amalek from under heaven." ¹⁵Moses built an altar there and named it Jehovah-Nissi (which means "the Lord is my banner." ¹⁶He said, "They have raised their fist against the LORD's throne, so now the LORD will be at war with Amalek generation after generation."

Jehovah- Tsidkenu – "The Lord our Righteousness" – Jer. 23:5-6 Jeremiah 23:1-6

"What sorrow awaits the leaders of my people—the shepherds of my sheep—for they have destroyed and scattered the very ones they were expected to care for," says the Lord. ²Therefore, this is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says to these shepherds: "Instead of caring for my flock and leading them to safety, you have deserted them and driven them to destruction. Now I will pour out judgment on you for the evil you have done to them. ³But I will gather together the remnant of my flock from the countries where I have driven them. I will bring them back to their own sheepfold, and they will be fruitful and increase in number. ⁴Then I will appoint responsible shepherds who will care for them, and they will never be afraid again. Not a single one will be lost or missing. I, the Lord, have spoken!

⁵"For the time is coming," says the Lord, "when I will raise up a righteous descendant from King David's line. He will be a King who rules with wisdom. He will do what is just and right throughout the land. ⁶And this will be his name: 'The Lord Is Our Righteousness.' In that day Judah will be saved, and Israel will live in safety.

CONCLUSION

The prophet Jeremiah predicted the coming of a king who would be called the Lord, our righteousness. Jesus fulfilled this prophecy by restoring our relationship with God through his life, death, and resurrection. Paul proclaims in his letter to the Romans, But now a righteousness from God, apart from the Law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testified. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe (Romans 3:21-22).

In Revelation. 1:8., John writes what Jesus spoke to him: "I AM the Alpha and the Omega - the beginning and the end, says the Lord God. I AM the one who is, who always was, and who is still to come, the Almighty One.

I AM is the name of God in the Old Testament. Jesus applied this name to himself. Alpha and Omega. Are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. They signify that God's actions are all-encompassing. God is fully in control.

God announced Himself, to Abram, I AM EL Shaddai, (The Almighty) and Jesus announces himself also The Almighty for they are one.

Strong's Definition: properly to mend (by stitching), i.e. (figuratively) to cure: (cause to) heal, physician, repair, thoroughly make whole.

<u>Brown-Driver-Briggs Lexicon</u>: heal, mend, repair, pacify, stitch together, healer, physician, heal hurts of nations (including backslidings and wounds), heal individual distresses, heal diseases, bring restoration

Jehovah Rapha is not limited to physical healing...Jehovah Rapha heals in totality: physical, spiritual, mental, social, creation...anywhere there is brokenness Jehovah Rapha makes whole!

Forgetting the name of God (44:20). Many of the pagan religions of OT times taught that a god's power was tied directly to its name. The false prophets of Jeremiah's time believed that, if they could erase God's name from the people's memory, they would follow Baal instead (Jer. 23:26-27). However, God does not forget his people, even when they have forgotten him (Deut. 4:31).
