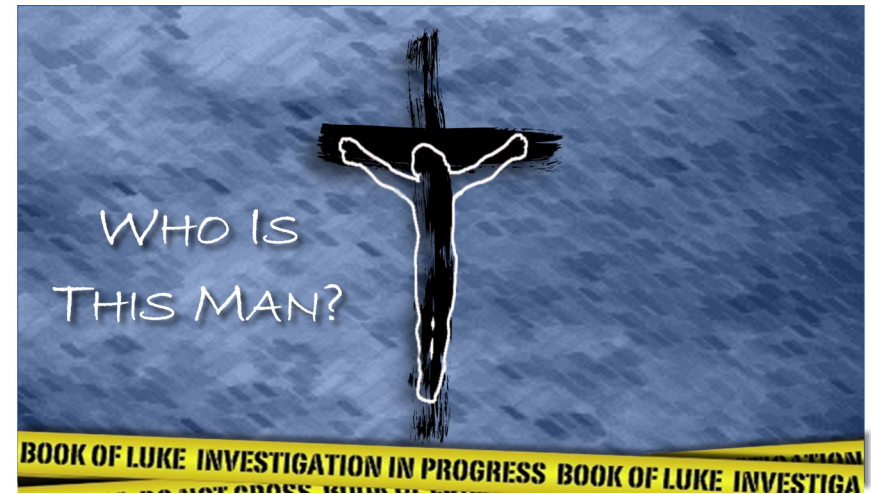


Read 1 Timothy 6:6-10. In what ways could the love of money show up in day-to-day life? In what way can a desire for money pierce someone with “many sorrows?”
