The sermon lists several types of dysfunction we face: loneliness, endless striving, feeling like we're falling, overwhelming responsibilities, and our own sinfulness. Which of these resonates most with your current season, and how does Genesis 1 speak hope into that situation?

Hebrews 11:3 says "by faith we understand that the entire universe was formed at God's command." How does trusting God as Creator help you trust Him as your Savior and Lord in daily life?

Bonus Reflection: If someone asked why Genesis 1 matters today, what would you say based on this sermon?

A LOSER CHAPTER 1

The sermon mentions how easy it is to "read the bible year after year and still miss things" about God as Creator. What's one thing about God's character that you've discovered or rediscovered recently in Scripture?
