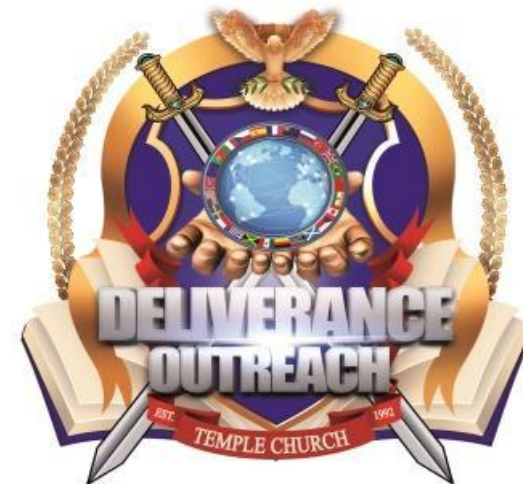

NURSING HOME MINISTRY

The Nursing Home Ministry meets every 2nd Sunday at Ahava Healthcare Of Clarksville at 111 Ussery Road, Clarksville, TN . We visit the Nursing Home from approximately 3:00 PM until 4:00 PM, and volunteers of all ages are welcome.

We meet in the TV room, which is where most of the long term residents are at this time of the day, and are typically joined by 15 to 20 of the residents with rehab patients and their visitors sometimes joining us.

Our service begins with praise and worship thru song or dance. This is, followed by prayer and scripture. We then are blessed to have a word (approximately 5 to 10 minutes) of encouragement from one of D.O.T. Ministers and different Auxiliaries each month and lesson theme. This ministry of word is then followed up by another selection from the choir or a soloist. At the end of each service, the volunteers will visit individuals, hugging, touching a hand or a shoulder and praying when feeling led to do so. Occasionally, a volunteer may choose to stay a little longer to pray or minister to someone or visit someone who was unable to attend the group service.

During the holidays, we give each attending resident a gift (Christmas, Valentines Day, Mother and Father's Day) We are always looking for gifts that are handmade such as prayer blankets, pillows, personal holders that attach to the residents wheel chairs and lap throws).

Our Youth Ministry make arts and crafts projects for each attending resident.

We keep it simple. God is Love. We are commanded to love one another, and to preach the Gospel to the world.

If you become part of the Nursing Home Ministry, please do not come if you are sick with the flu, or have a fever or a rash. Be sure to wash your hands before you leave the facility. You are welcome to join us whenever you can. If you have any questions, please contact: ,

Here are some interesting facts about nursing homes:

- There are currently 17,000 nursing homes in the USA.
- 1.6 million people reside in nursing facilities.
- The average number of beds per nursing home is 107, with an occupancy rate of 88%.
- More than 90% of nursing home residents are 65 years old and above. Almost half are 85 years old and above.
- The average age upon admission to a nursing home is 79.
- Women are almost three times as likely to live in nursing homes than men.
- In 1999-2000, the average nursing facility patient required assistance with 3.75 activities of daily living. Five common activities are used to measure the functionality of an elderly patient. These include: bathing, dressing, transferring, toileting and eating.
- 42% of nursing home patients suffer from some form of dementia.
- 33% of nursing home patients have documented signs of depression.

In 2000, 4.5% of Americans 65 years and older lived in nursing homes, a decline from 5.1 percent in 1990.
