On Thursday we went grocery shopping for supplies, and then prepared 100 sandwiches and bagged lunches to be dropped off at a local soup kitchen that gives out these lunches on Saturdays.

In the evenings and on our rec day, we were fortunate to see some of the beautiful Oregon scenery. We visited Broughton Beach Park, Multnomah Falls, and Tunnel Beach. We also got to explore downtown Portland.
