Sequencing skills will be used in making paper chains to decorate our classroom, and beaded candy cane tree ornaments. Other Christmas projects will include collage decorated stars and Christmas trees, a variety of ornaments, and a surprise gift for our parents! We are going to be busier than Santa's elves!

Sweet smells of Christmas will abound when we bake sugar cookies to enjoy at snack time, after reading about our story friend, Arthur, and his dilemma in *Arthur's Christmas Cookies*. Other holiday books to be shared will include: *A Merry Mouse Christmas ABC, Once There Was a Christmas Tree, The Christmas Star, Surprise, Surprise! Our indoor climber will be transformed into a "Gingerbread House" this month, welcoming friends for tea and visiting, or provide a quiet place to look at Christmas books. Our puppet theater will become a stable this month, complete with a wide assortment of animal and Nativity puppets.
