#### God Winks

I'd like to share with all of you a series of books which has had a profound effect on me. I came across one of them as I was browsing in a bookstore a few years ago and have since shared this with many of my friends. The reaction from everyone that has read it has been so positive that I wanted to share it further. The author is SQuire Rushnell (yes a capital Q) and his books are about "God Winks".

A God Wink is what some people would call a "coincidence".... an answered prayer or simply an experience where you'd say, "Wow, what are the odds of that?". The author wrote his first book after living through the inevitable death of his newborn son and experiencing his miraculous recovery.

So once I became aware of what a God Wink was, I could reminisce the many things that I have experienced or witnessed in other's lives (both small and large) and was able to realize that It was God's hand at work in the situation and not what we might have categorized a 'coincidence'.

A wonderful example of this for us at EULC was the murder of our own church member and friend, Earl Olander What a coincidence that these men who killed and robbed him would have taken Earl's Bible (complete with the evidence of ownership) and then left it in their vacated Minneapolis apartment. Or might we call this a God Wink?

Mr. Rushnell's books are a compilation of real life stories about people and their God Winks. The stories are uplifting and spirit-filled. I think it is a God Wink that I discovered the book!

# East Union History....

At a Synod conference meeting in East Union in October 1862, a question about the church school and where it should be moved to was discussed because the location in Red Wing wasn't working. East Union was chosen and at the next conference meeting in June of 1864, the East Union church agreed to sell the building they were using as the church for \$300.00 to the school. The building was moved across the street to the 5-acre piece the Civil War vets had purchased and was rebuilt adding a second story, and thus St Ansgar's Academy was born. The Church reserved the right to use the building for two years until the new church was built. The first director was Reverend Jackson. A side note on Reverend Jackson is from 1862; He was a pastor in the western part of the state, holding services in homes in that area. One day during a service some neighbors came running to the cabin and said the Indians attacked them. This was one of the first acts of war in the Indian uprising. Reverend Jackson ended up in Hutchison and eventually at East Union. Funding for the school was to come from a grist mill built along Beven's Creek about a mile up the road. The mill was built on the east side of the road and a race to move the water to the mill wheel built from the west. That race can still be seen today if you know where to look. Unfortunately, the mill didn't do as well as expected due to a flow of water that was erratic, sometimes too much and other times not enough. It did stay in operation until about 1900 when it was sold and moved. The school was moved to St Peter in 1878 and the name was changed again, this time to Gustavus Adolphus. The stone wheel used in grinding the grain can still be seen on the campus of Gustavus. Reverend Jackson stayed and was West Union's Pastor for some time. A couple students that went on to fame were Andrew Holt, Supreme Court Justice, and Minnesota Governor Lind. Reverend Jackson's house is still directly across the road and the next building is St Ansgar's Academy minus the second floor. It became our fellowship hall.
