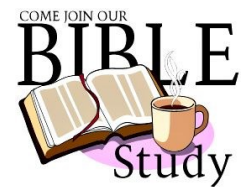

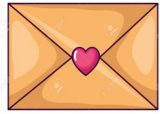
Gathering Thru Fellowship

Christmas Eve Offering 2024

Traditionally, the Christmas Eve Offerings collected by EULC have been given to various charitable organizations locally, regionally and globally. This year, the council voted to split the offering equally between Carver Ridge Senior Living (local), Bountiful Basket (regional) and ELCA Good Gifts (global). The global donation would go towards "God's Global Barnyard." Examples of the barnyard include --



10 Chicks - when they grow up to become chickens, their eggs not only provide an ongoing supply of protein-rich meals, they can also help start a small business and generate a steady source of income -- \$10



Goat - fresh milk from a goat provides daily nutrition for children and their families. -- \$50

Cow -- one dairy cow can produce a few gallons of milk each day -- \$500

Piglet -- provides a source of natural fertilizer or sold at market to provide funds to support the family -- \$30

Honeybees -- provides honey to eat and beeswax to transform into handcrafted soaps and candles plus they boost crop growth by pollinating plants -- \$20
