Dear Disciples,

We light four candles. All is still. All is calm. Everything is about to change. Has our patience paid off? Have our efforts to make a difference truly changed lives? Are we, but humble servants of God, worthy of such a gift—the gift of life and love?

Unique Christmas Traditions from Around the World

Sweden: The Swedes construct at Yule Goat. This tradition dates back to pagan festivals. However, in 1966, the tradition was changed when someone came up with the idea to make a giant straw goat, now referred to as the Gavle Goat. The goat is more thana 42' high, 23' wide, and weighs 3.6 tons. It is taken down after the New Year.



Japan: Although Christmas isn't a national holiday in Japan, the citizens still find an interesting and delicious way to celebrate. Rather than gathering around for a turkey dinner, families head out to their local Kentucky Fried Chicken. The tradition began in 1974 after a wildly successful marketing campaign called "*Kurisumasu ni wa kentakkii!*" or "Kentucky for Christmas!" People wait in line for hours!

Iceland: Similar to the 12 days of Christmas in the U.S., Iceland celebrates 13 days. Each night before Christmas, Icelandic children are visited by the 13 Yule Lads. After placing their shoes by the window, the little ones head to bed. In the morning, they'll either have received candy (if they're good) or be greeted with shoes full of rotten potatoes if they're bad.



Mexico: All across Mexico members of the Church put on Pastorelas (Shepherd's Plays) to retell the Christmas story. The Mexican Christmas season begins early in December with Las Posadas, a religious march that re-enacts the journey of Mary and Joseph. The vibrant red poinsettia flowers are also used in holiday arrangements for decoration throughout the country.

The Netherlands: *Sinterklaas* is the Dutch name for Saint Nicholas, the man recognized by children by his long white beard, red cape, and red miter. Kids put a shoe by the chimney or back door and wake up on Christmas morning to find treats like gingerbread men, marzipan, and chocolate letters inside.

Ireland: The Irish leave a tall red candle in a front window overnight, a welcoming symbol of warmth and shelter for the holiday season. Traditional Christmas fare in Ireland often includes homemade roast goose, vegetables, cranberries, and potatoes.
