Council Update—Church council met Tuesday Feb 11 at 6pm. Those in attendance were Kathy Schallberg, Jamie Scott, Jeri Bowers, Jane Matthesen, Paul Lundquist, Jason Wieland, Larry Cruse, and Kent Hasse.

We first welcomed new councilor Jane. Then Pastor shared details about her past month and that there were extra donations received for the doors. It was discussed that once the doors were funded, new donations for building projects will be used for other future construction projects. There was a lengthy discussion around Children of Tomorrow daycare in Carver who approached the church because they have hit maximum occupancy in their current building. They need a space to house the school age children's program this summer and proposed renting the Parish Center space at EULC. Council asked a small committee of Larry, Kent, Jamie, and Pastor to further explore the feasibility of hosting a daycare at EULC this summer.

The treasurer's report was also reviewed and approved. We then reviewed the new councilor terms and held elections where Kent Hasse was elected President, Larry Cruse as Vice President, and Jason Wieland as Secretary. A list of all current councilors and terms will be printed and posted in the parish center for the congregation. A nominating committee was discussed and will be formed this fall to identify potential new council members for the elections at the annual meeting in Jan 2021. Council will also be asking for congregation participation for this committee. Members of each committee (at least those that wish to be listed) will be posted to either a bulletin board or printed in the bulletin as requested at the annual meeting so the congregation can find a person to communicate with on each committee.

Committee meetings were discussed. Notably the spaghetti dinner was highly successful and council member Kathy wanted to share how effective and efficient that committee functions working together for a common goal. The total funds raised are not yet known, but will be well over \$3,000. Worship and music met to set plans for Lent and Easter services. The lunch and dinner services will continue as Pastor felt this was welcomed by church members at EULC. Easter services will be at 7am and 9am. Councilor Jane is planning to join the Food and Fellowship committee.
