Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear Disciples,

The calendar has turned to a new year. The shortest day of winter has come and gone. The busyness of Thanksgiving and Christmas are behind us. Now, we're often told to focus on the new possibilities that 2023 will bring.

Every January is a wonderful time to have this reset: To refocus, set new goals, and find renewed energy in pursuing change in our lives. But, how many of these New Year's resolutions come to a crashing halt by the time February rolls around?

I don't know about you, but I often struggle to follow through on my New Year's resolutions. I have no problem making a list of goals I would love to accomplish, but here's the thing: how often are our goals only focused on the new? How often are our goals singularly focused on making radical changes in our lives or picking up habits that we've either never done before or are horribly out of practice?

What if our focus for the new year wasn't solely focused on the new and instead also included renewal? Instead of picking up new habits, what if we refined old ones? Instead of forcing radical change upon ourselves that only comes to a screeching halt in one month's time, what if we tweaked a current habit that's already an active part of our lives?

Together, let's put renewed focus on the gifts and skills we've received from Jesus. We'll find that radical change happens when we make one more call, send one more card, offer one more minute, or give one more dollar. Radical change doesn't happen overnight, it's a journey. A journey you're already on and it's a journey I look forward to making with you into the future at East Union and with our neighbors both near and far.

East Union History....continued from December

Our first Pastor, Pehr Carlson was our leader for some 20 years. His brother A.J. Carlson owned a store in East Union, was the East Union postmaster, chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and other civic endeavors. One of his sons E.E. Carlson started the first newspaper in the area and we have copies from 1895 to 1898. His sister Lydia saved them and put them in book form. They are a treasure trove of information of life in the 1890's. A.J. also kept a diary of his time spent in the Indian War and the Civil War. He put them in story form and had them printed in the East Union News. Speaking of the Civil War, we have grave sites for 31 of our veterans, a lot of them were in company H of the Minnesota 9th. Most of the people of our church came to this area starting in 1854, a long hard trip across the ocean and half America to try and stake out a new life in a wild undeveloped area and yet when the Indian uprising and then the Civil War began, many of them left their homes and families to help, spending about 3 years away fighting to preserve this country. This is remarkable.

At our 150th celebration in 2008, one of our events was a ghost tour. We chose 12 of the first members in the cemetery and brought them to life, telling about their lives and how their families were connected together. As an extension of that we are now attempting to generate a burial sheet for each person in our cemetery that tells when and where they were born, and who their parents, brothers, sisters and spouses were. We have 29 mini family trees that show how the people in our cemetery are all part of one big family and where they are buried. Our belief is that those aren't just stones around the church, they represent the lives of the people that started and brought this church forward through the years until this day.
