### Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear disciples,

The Christmas decorations are slowly being put away. Family gatherings with their food, laughter, and travel have come and gone. The silent nights of the Christmas season have faded from view.

The new year has begun! Every year the calendar turns over it feels as if all things are possible. And why not? Why shouldn't 2024 be filled with endless opportunities? Well, perhaps *endless* is a bit of a stretch—I, maybe like you, often make resolutions in January only to find them broken by February.

Which is a bit odd given the excitement the new year generates. How is it possible that within one month most of us have fallen into the doldrums of winter—the hope, joy, and excitement of "all things are possible" turned into "maybe next year?"
