


Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear Disciples,

It's been raining a lot lately. Rain that's good for the crops, plants, and animals. But, rain that makes it hard for us humans to get out and about. Rain and clouds and humidity that make you want to stay inside—stay inside, that is, if you're an adult. Because my kids have found this rain quite enjoyable.

Rain that makes me stay under an umbrella while they escape the dry confines of such a thing so they can run around the yard while getting soaked. Rain that creates puddles all over—puddles that are ripe for the jumping in. Boots are placed on feet, raincoats are put over arms and body, and then the fun begins.

It doesn't stop until bodies are wet, legs are laced with mud, and every single puddle has been found and disturbed. Puddles that once jumped in form ripples. Puddles whose water goes splashing up and out over the grass and driveway. Water that then flows out and downward, away from the happy feet of a couple kids. Water that moves onward.

Because when you jump in a puddle, you create ripples. Ripples and splashes that travel far beyond you—water that moves onward to places unknown and people unreached. And all it took was one, single act to make it happen.

As we travel through the book of Luke throughout the remainder of this summer and into the fall, we'll encounter a ministry of Jesus that reaches out to the poor and forsaken. A ministry that doesn't heal all people with the snap of a finger, but a ministry that meets people one at a time. One healing at a time, one miracle at a time, one encounter at a time, Jesus will make his presence known.

And once he does so, the people who encounter him cannot help but shout and sing his praises. They cannot help but tell others what they have witnessed and seen. Once Jesus creates a ripple of forgiveness or grace or purpose, that ripple extends far beyond that one moment or person. That ripple, that splash of water travels—and my, oh my, does it travel far and wide.

Never discount how far the ripples and splashes you make will travel. For you haven't been called to show Jesus' grace and mercy and love to every, single person on this planet. No, you've been called to make ripples and create splashes. You've been called to make small and significant changes with the people you meet. For in doing so, those ripples will turn into waves that move far beyond what you could've ever imagined.

Together, let's play in the rain. Let's create ripples of hope and peace for a world in need. For together, and with the Holy Spirit by our side, the ripples we make in the world will turn into waves of change that bring about the presence of Jesus!



Almond Bars Recipe from Evelyn Grimm

Ingredients: 4 eggs, 2 cups sugar, 1 cup melted butter, 2 cups flour, 1 1/2 teaspoons almond extract

Directions: Beat the eggs and sugar until lemon color. Add butter, flour and extract. Spread into a 9×13 inch greased baking pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean in the center. Cool on a wire rack. Sprinkle with confectioners sugar.

Frost with: 1 1/2 cup powdered sugar, 1/4 cup butter, 1 1/2 Tablespoons milk, 1 teaspoon almond extract

East Union History

Lyle Lund came to be in East Union in a little different route than the other people we have interviewed. His story starts with Magnus Johnson, Magnus was one of our early settlers and active in the community and at East Union Church. His first born daughter, Mary, wed John Hurtig, second daughter, Christine, married Johan Hallin, son, August, married Anna Lund, Anna Johnson was next marrying Cornelius Smith. There were also a few babies who died very young. How does all this tie into Lyle, just wait. August and Anna adopted J. Russell and Reuben Lund. Reuben married Rose Bahr, and finally along came Lyle, their only son.

Lyle grew up on a 100 acre farm along current County Road 50 just up the hill from Bevens Creek where it crosses the road. The farm didn't have as much crop land as other farms but it did have Bevens Creek valley along the back side and some crop land across the road, enough to keep some cows, pigs and chickens. The house near the present day Lundstead Acres sign, the barn was just behind the house. Lyle remembers one of the chickens his mom favored was called KaKa and came to the house for treats every day. KaKa met an untimely demise and Lyle remembers how sad his mom felt. His dad buried KaKa and made a tombstone for her which made mom feel at least a little better. Growing up with a big woods on the farm, Lyle became interested in hunting and trapping and fishing in the creek. He enjoyed hunting squirrels and jack rabbits when he could. He liked riding one of the horses named Flossie bareback down the old road in the woods and galloping her back up the hill. Scotty Hallin, who lived across the road, taught Lyle some of the finer points of trapping, mink and muskrats.

Also living just down the hill was Emily Beckman. He attended East Union school and remembers his 5th grade class consisting of he and Darryl Hunter. Some winter time activities Lyle enjoyed were skating and tobogganing. Skating took place on the creek and on Goetze Lake which is almost across from the church. They would scrape the snow off to make a nice rink. Lyle could skate backwards almost as well as forwards around the rink. The toboggan hill was located at the Scott Hallin farm. It started on top the hill behind their buildings and ended up by the barn. One time a little rain fell and froze making the hill a super fast ride.

The first tractor on the Lund farm was a Farmall C. and his first car was a Model A Ford with poor brakes, but it got him out and about to his various jobs and hunting spots. He worked for Ray Lundquist loading bales and shocking grain and at Herb Lundquists farm he drove horses pulling the bundle wagon, a load of grain bundles heading for the threshing machine for the hourly wage of .65 cents. In addition to he helped his dad on their farm during harvest.

Lyle was baptized and confirmed at East Union. Pastor Kindgren was the confirmation teacher and his classmates were Marjolane Adamson, Pat Olson, Allan Quatman, Betty Lou Johnson, Pearl Lindquist, Charles Kindgren, Carol Scott, Catherine Frank, and Curtis Mueller all graduating in 1948. The Lutefisk dinners bring back happy memories with the congregation all working together to put on the big event.

After grade school, Lyle went on to Chaska High School, worked at Ford Company for about a year and then was drafted into the Army during the Korean War. He was fortunate enough to stay stateside during his enlistment. After discharge he returned to the Ford Plant in St. Paul where he spent 30 years building Ford cars and trucks. He married LuAnn Lenzen and is the proud father of Lisa and Luke. After retirement from Ford he lived for a time in the church janitors house next to the hall. With the cemetery across the road, he began helping out and then took over as custodian. He kept it trimmed and mowed, flowers watered and branches picked up when needed. He also enjoyed meeting and talking to the people who would stop by to visit a grave. He would help them by setting up markers or plant stands or anything that enhanced the looks of the cemetery. Lyle and Bev were friends when they were children and be-

came reacquainted by this time and purchased the Claire Edberg house in East Union.

One of Lyle's favorite pastimes was a game called cribbage. He played once a week and attended tournaments on weekends, some as far away as Reno, Nevada. He won first place in numerous tournaments.


