Love INC means "Love In the Name of Christ"".. Iet was founded in 1977 by Dr. Virgil Walker, a social worker, in Holland, Michigan. Virgil Walker was passionate about serving others less fortunate. He set about organizing area churches to help serve the poor by working together. Currently, Love INC is active in 29 states and in Kenya, with 7800 partner churches and growing!

Love INC of Eastern Carver County started in 2006. There are currently 33 churches in our community that partner with Love INC. To belong, each church needs 2-3 members who head up the "Gap" ministry, such as towels (!!), kitchen supplies, baby needs, bed linens, etc. These "team heads" then receive help, through donations across the Love INC community, to help set up their ministry. When the ministry is ready to go, it gets added to the network.

The Love INC office in Chaska acts as the clearinghouse. Volunteers take down information from the client. Some of that information, for instance personal circumstances, income or lack of it, are kept private. There is, however, a requirement that a person using Love INC services qualify as "poor". The needs of the client are taken, then disseminated to the heads of the various ministries at each church. It then becomes that ministry's team to gather the items necessary, contact the client, and deliver the items as soon as it's mutually possible.

We require clients to be home when we make a delivery. That way, we get to meet them face to face! Overwhelmingly, people are so grateful! It always makes me feel so good to know that I had a real part in making another person's life just a little bit better.

You may wonder, does anyone try to cheat the system? I don't know the answer to that. I do know that, one time recently, I was texting a client to arrange a towel delivery. My phone indicated that I had dialed this number before, so I called the Love INC office to ask if clients were allowed more than one delivery. No, it is a one-time gift. I then texted the client to explain the policy, with no further issues.

Currently, my husband Gordon and I run this ministry. We really want to encourage others to get involved! (I especially would like to see our kids get involved with this in some way). It isn't hard, it doesn't take up a lot of time, and you will get training! It would be especially helpful to have someone coordinate an East Union New Towel (we only use new towels now) Drive, maybe 3 times a year. Or perhaps there are other ways to do this. Please consider helping! Thanks!!
