Congregational Meeting

The purpose of this meeting will be to hold a ballot vote on the acceptance of our Pastoral Call to Pastor Bryant Bakkum as our new permanent Pastor. Following is a summary of The Rev. Bryant Jeremy Bakkum.

He grew up in the small town of Westby, WI, has a wife and two small children and lives in Eden Prairie MN. He was an Organist from 2000–2013. Served as an Intern Pastor from 2013–2014, a Pastor in West Allis, WI, from 2013-2019, and currently an Associate Pastor at Prairie Lutheran Church, Eden Prairie, MN. The comments below were copied from his profile and fit with our interviews that excited us to recommend him.

I am familiar with preaching using the Revised Common Lectionary, Narrative Lectionary, and topical series. I believe in order to make a message relevant it must connect daily life with the biblical passage. In order to do this, I engage the five senses: I use audio, video, and photos when relevant during my preaching to activate the imagination. I view preaching as an opportunity to take the listener on a journey from an obscure aspect of daily life and showcase how the day's passage connects in beautiful and wonderful ways. Worship is our opportunity to praise and give thanks to God! I try to bring an energetic passion to the worship experience. I often custom build worship elements to fit the day's theme so provide an all-inclusive experience for the congregant. I love designing and creating worship themes -- this summer I designed a worship theme around being on the road since many of our members are traveling. Instead of lamenting people leaving for the summer I used it as an opportunity to design our worship around the beauty of God's creation and as a reminder that whether inperson or at the cabin we all have the ability to experience the majesty of God. I absolutely love crafting sermons and preaching them -- they are a sacred space that is filled with both humor and learning, surprises and comfort. I have been involved in worship leadership for nearly two decades. I have been involved in leading a worship service through preaching, presiding, assisting, and music. Leadership in music includes: organist, pianist, soloist, accompanist, and member of a worship band.

Congregational Meeting, cont'd

In my current setting I strongly emphasize the arts. I have taught Vacation Bible School, Sunday school, Confirmation, and Bible Studies. At the heart of everything I do is the energy, spirit, and passion received through and in the presence of Christ. Music has always been an important part of my life. From a young age I have played piano and was an organist for my hometown congregation throughout middle and high school. I fully believe music to be yet another way to experience the Gospel. Liturgical rites, sermons, baptism, and other parts of a worship service are each powerful in their own ways. So, too, is music. Everyone has the ability to impact the world in large and small ways and if I become your Pastor I promise to do my best to fill your expectations.

Church Council: An Opportunity for Involvement....

We have three spots open on the Council for 2023. As a little background on the council per the Bylaws, The Congregation Council serves as the board of directors of the congregation. The Council has control and management of the property of the congregation and is authorized to transact congregational business. Decisions made by the Council are subject to review by the congregation at annual and special meetings. The Council is responsible for the supervision of all committees and staff supporting the congregation and serves at the pleasure of the congregation. Each Council member serves as a liaison to a committee of their choosing.

Council terms run for 3 years. The Council consists of 9 members. Each year there are 3 terms that will expire. Each council member may only be on Council for a total of 2 consecutive terms.
