


Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear Disciples,

The leaves keep changing colors. They continue to fall. We rake them up, bag them up, send them away only to see a clean and clear yard become leaf-covered as more leaves fall. This process will continue for a bit longer.

Leaves fall, leaves are picked up.

I, when time allows, do this. Rake and then bag the leaves. However, more often than not, I simply fire up the lawn mower and mulch them up. Turn them into little bits that remain out in the yard, but in a smaller, less visible form.

Leaves that once turned sunlight into food for the trees now have a new purpose. Because although it looks like life is leaving those once green trees, those brown and yellow and orange leaves are now serving a new purpose: providing the plants of the ground with nutrients.

What once gave life to the trees is now giving life to the ground. Because even for the leaves of the trees, death is not the end—new life always springs forth. So it is for us. Having just celebrated Reformation Sunday and All Saints' Day, we are reminded of the life-giving presence we receive in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

We are reminded that death is not the end; that the power of sin does not enslave us; that the forces that would seek to separate from the love of Jesus have found themselves rent asunder. Because in the death and resurrection of Jesus, the end is no longer the end. Death is no longer the final chapter—it is only the beginning.

For like the beautiful leaves gracing the ground, there is still life to be found. In this season of change, in this season of gray skies and leafless trees, let's hold fast to the promise given to us in the death and resurrection of Jesus: that death is not the end.

Let's celebrate and give thanks for the gift of new life that begins now—a gift that joy-fully sends us out into God's creation proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ.


Gathering Thru Fellowship

Veterans Day—November 11

Veterans Day is a U.S. legal holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. Veterans Day 2025 will occur on Tuesday, November 11. In 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities,



was declared between the Allied Nations and Germany in World War I, then known as "the Great War."

Commemorated in many countries as Armistice Day the following year, November 11th became a federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day.
