


#### Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear disciples,

Fall is nearly here! A season filled with cooler weather, shorter days, and the sights and smells of apple orchards, pumpkin pies, and colorful leaves. In short, it is a season of change.

And while the seasons changing may bring about excitement, change within our own lives may make us feel apprehensive and anxious. I know this is certainly the case for my family. This summer has been one new thing after another. Weeks filled with different activities—from mini-vacations, to day trips, to school and daycare events.

From family celebrations and gatherings with friends to preparations for the upcoming school year. And although I write this less than one week before the start of a new school year, I have a strong suspicion that the new school year will *not* bring with it a new sense of routine and ritual. Because, like a river, the waters of change always flow.

Although a river remains constant, its waters are always changing. Although a river looks similar each time you view its banks, the waters that flow in between are fresh and new each year, each month, each minute. Life, it turns out, is as steady as a river and as changing as its waters.

It is a both/and. Both persistent and sure while simultaneously filled with upheaval and change. What is one to do during such a time—such a life? Perhaps, hold on while also moving forward.

There was a river near the cabin I stayed at recently. That river contained both calm waters and small rapids. Campers were given tubes to lazily float down the river—tubes that allowed you to relax and take in the sights when things were calm and tubes that you gripped tightly when you passed over the rapids.

The river also dictated which direction you traveled: forward. There was no turning back, no staying in place, no meandering here then there. And even though you couldn't necessarily dictate your direction, you did have a choice to make: your reaction to the sometimes unpredictable and forever changing conditions of the river around you.

In the midst of change, in the midst of circumstances and situations that often seem forced upon us, in the midst of a life that seems anything but certain or predictable, we do have a choice: the choice to hold onto the presence of the Holy Spirit that surrounds us and uplifts us each and every day. The choice to embrace the good gifts God has given us. The choice to be the hands and feet of Jesus to family, friends, and neighbors.

The choice to, in the midst of uncertainty, embrace the certain presence of Christ in our lives. Because although this life may feel uncertain, you have the certain promise of peace, hope, joy, and love through and with your Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

All we need to do is embrace it as the waters of new life carry you forward.
