

Words from Pastor Bryant

Dear disciples,




Ordination Thank you

Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Salem Congregation February 9, 1891 - - January 24, 1952

The Centennial History of the East Union Evangelical Lutheran Church would be quite incomplete if some history of the Salem congregation of Carver would not be given even though Salem organized their own congregation in 1891.

During the past one hundred years the East Union and Salem congregations in general associated very closely, such as always sharing the the same pastor and having the same cemetery privileges. The Salem congregation could well have been considered a sub-division of the East Union congregation ever since it was organized in 1858.

Quite a number of the Charter Members of the East Union congregation lived in the Carver area when it was organized in 1858 and for the best interest of the church the congregation was divided into six districts commonly known as (rote) and the members from Carver were included in the congregation's (5th) fifth district.

Being that the Village of Carver was the terminating point of transportation by boats on the Minnesota River from Minneapolis and St. Paul and being that transportation by boat was the general means of travel at that time, Carver became a big business trading center and soon had a brick yard started and a plow and farm implement manufacturing plant in operation. With these and other incurring interests the Village population grew quite rapidly from 1858 to 1900 and in 1876 the Carver Village had a population of about 700 of which one half were Germans and the other half Swedes.

Even though Carver was getting to be a very progressive town there likewise came to pass a church problem for the Swedish people living in the Village and the closely surrounding area due to their type of employment. Only a few families had any need of horses and being that horse and buggy was the only way of traveling with the exception of walking, it also showed its effect on getting to and from church in East Union.

In the year 1876 the Swedish people living in and around Carver came to a point where they saw that something had to be done in regard to their spiritual needs, even though at that time Carver already had two churches. Neither of these met the approval of the Swedish people, as one was of a different denomination and the other held services in the German language which the Swedish people

could not understand. Therefore a meeting of these Swedish people was held and they presented the following requests to the East Union Church. They wished to redistrict the East Union congregation and form an additional district to be known as District No. 7 which would include Carver Village and its close surrounding area. They wished to be represented on the Board of Administration by one Deacon and one Trustee and to be authorized to build a church building in the Village of Carver to be fully paid for by the new district. All of the above requests were granted and the Salem Church was built in 1876 and they shared the same pastor with the East Union congregation who had charge of all services until December 17, 1890. A large number of the members living in and around Carver met in the A. L. Skoog store located on the corner of Broadway and Fourth Street in the Village of Carver. By petition they requested of the East Union congregation, 1st: That District No. 7 be discontinued and organized into a congregation of its own. 2nd: To share the services of the same pastor with East Union and to have one forenoon service and two (either afternoon or evening) services each month and to pay \$250 annually as a pastor's salary for these services. 3rd: To retain the same privileges in the East Union Cemetery as in the past. The above petition was presented to the East Union congregation on January 2, 1891 and on January 6, 1891 the East Union congregation gave the following reply. 1st: That the Trustees of the East Union congregation get a legal deed for the lot and church property located on Lot 6, Block 19 in the Village of Carver, Minnesota and give said deed to the Trustees of the new (Salem) congregation as soon as they had incorporated and had been accepted as a congregation by the Minnesota Conference of the Augustana Synod. 2nd: That a boundary line between East Union and the Salem congregation be established and after such a boundary line was agreed upon no member could transfer from one parish to the other unless approved of by two-thirds of the Board of Administration members of both church Boards, 3rd: That the members of the Salem congregation have the same privileges in the East Union Cemetery as the members of the East Union congregation.

On February 9, 1891 all the requirements had been fulfilled and the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Salcm congregation was organized on this date.
