By now, I am sure you are aware that we are currently experiencing a global pandemic brought on by the Coronavirus (COVID-19). This letter serves as an update and response for you and our church community.

After consulting key church administrators, please know that we will comply with federal, state and local governing bodies, by canceling in-person worship services and meetings for at least the next two weeks beginning this Sunday, March 22, 2020. Some meetings will still take place, but through teleconferencing (not in person). Keeping you healthy and safe is of our highest priority.

As a church community, in addition to trusting in Jesus, here are some other ways you can respond to the Coronavirus (COVID-19): Pray for mercy for the sick, strength for doctors, insight for researchers, and wisdom for church administrators. Look for opportunities to love and care for others, whether they are sick, isolated, quarantined, or filled with anxiety, and avoid any semblance of prejudice or racism against those wrongly blamed for this outbreak.

Although our church building will be closed, we the people are the “Church” and we will still be having Church. The blessing technology offers us is the ability to do that, even if its online. — **Direct Bank Giving**

Contact your bank and setup Grace Temple Baptist Church as a vendor via your bill payment system.

— **Standard Mail**

Send your gifts through the standard mail (Please do not send cash).

— **Pick-Up Giving**

Call the church office and leave a message that you would like your gift picked-up from your home and we will make arrangements to have it picked up.


