

Larry Richards has directed hundreds of Retreats, Parish Missions and Conferences for young and old alike. His inspirational talks and presentations, always authentic and enthusiastic, have changed the hearts, minds, and lives of millions of listeners worldwide. He continues to accept invitations for speaking engagements all over the United States and in Canada and has recently traveled abroad to continue his mission of evangelization.

Father Larry currently serves as pastor of St. Joseph Church/Bread of Life Community in Erie, Pennsylvania. In 2004 Father founded The Reason For Our Hope Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to 'spreading the Good News' by educating others about Jesus Christ and the Catholic faith through CDs, DVDs and books.

He is the author of "Be a Man! Becoming the Man God Created You to Be", a #1 best seller for Ignatius Press, having sold over 100,000 copies. He also has a second book called "Surrender! The Life-Changing Power of Doing God's Will" published by Our Sunday Visitor which has sold over 40,000 copies. Father released a Catholic Men's Bible, NABRE, with Our Sunday Visitor in 2014, and also a Scripture Devotional Calendar entitled "No Bible, No Breakfast! No Bible, No Bed!" Father hosts the EWTN radio show called "The Reason For Our Hope", and a live EWTN radio show called "Open Line". Fr. Larry also hosts a radio show called "Changed Forever with Father Larry Richards" that can be heard nationwide on Relevant Radio

Elizabeth Bunbury



As you enter Elizabeth Bunbury's studio at Saint Petersburg Clay Company, Elizabeth looks like she has been playing in the sand. With her head, shoulders, knees and toes covered with dried clay; one can see that she has been at it all day.

Having experienced grief through the death of a husband, living with a spouse suffering from alcoholism and drug addiction, and the loss that comes with divorce, Elizabeth received strength and encouragement from women throughout her journey. In March of 2008, Elizabeth decided that she wanted to celebrate life by throwing herself a party for her 50th birthday. "I wanted to give something back to the women who mean so much in my life," says Elizabeth. She decided that she would make crosses.

Over 100 crosses of all sizes, shapes, and colors adorned the walls of her sun porch. As a party favor, each woman chose their "perfectly flawed" cross as unique and different as themselves - except one woman, Julie, who resisted taking a cross.

She explained to Elizabeth and the other women at the party that she was agnostic. She had fallen away from the church full of anger, resentment and confusion. Elizabeth acknowledged her story and let her be. The next morning, as their paths crossed, Julie said, "I left there and took this cross. I took the ugliest, most beaten up cross. It was imperfect in so many ways. It was also the most beautiful. The cross spoke to me. I related it to my personal faith, which felt bent, chipped and broken." She carried it for months as a reminder of the blessings in her life. Eventually, Julie passed her cross forward. Her new cross is a softer, smoother one and reflects the healing that came from this sharing of faith and hope.

Elizabeth credits this story for inspiring Answered Prayers Cross, Inc. – a nonprofit outreach ministry - believing that all prayers are answered here on Earth as people cross paths with one another. Every morning she offers up her prayer: "Here I am Lord, what can I do for you today?" As you leave her studio, you are inspired to open your heart, to find hope, to listen to others, to give freely... to share your story.
