Aly Raisman had done an amazing job in the London olympics. She had become the first American woman ever to win the gold in floor exercise.

She had shocked herself then. But standing on the podium for the all around competition had just slipped through her fingers.

In London, Raisman had just won a bronze medal on the beam and a gold medal in floor exercise, which put her in a tie for third place in the all around competition. Aly was going to win bronze in the all around. But there was a tie against the Russian gymnast Aliya Mustafina.

The tie was decided by omitting both Mustafina's and Raisman's lowest scores from the four events. Mustafina beat Raisman by 0.567 points, sealing Aly's fate, and knocking her off the podium she had worked so hard to get too.

Aly said after losing the bronze, "I think how painful it was for me, it will always bother me."

After that Aly left gymnastics for a year, but she later decided to come back. Many people said she couldn't do it. She would be 22, a "grandma" for the next Olympics. Even then she came back and made it onto the Olympic team in Rio.



Four years later, it was Thursday night. Aly Raisman had been one of the two athletes from the U.S

gymnastics team to go to the all around competition. It was right after the second rotation, and Aly was in fourth behind Mustafina who was leading in first.

"I feel like I'm better now than I was in 2012," Raisman said Thursday after taking silver in the all-around. "I'm very proud of that. It's obviously not something people expected or that's easy to do after taking a year off and being the 'Grandma,' as everyone likes to call me. I'm happy I
