After that, we went home.

The doctor prescribed medicine to help my eye, but it definitely would not be able to heal my eye. He also gave me a cotton eyepatch so people would not see my ugly burnt eye. The next morning the pain was unbearable; I wanted to rip off my

The people of America observe National Hispanic Heritage Month yearly. We do this by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens ancestors, who mostly came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

The observation started in about 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15.

It was inserted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402. The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September 18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.

For Hispanic Heritage Month at Judson, the high school Spanish class decided to get up and sing a song for the entire high school. The class sang a song called "Alguna Vez" written and sung by Marymar. Pastor Roberto Ramirez spoke in chapel, and students shared a delicious lunch of pupusas outside.
