Worship With Us

September, 2019

<u>Sunday, 1st – 12th Sunday after Pentecost</u> – Service of Word & Sacrament – Pastor Walter Wagner, presiding

Texts: Proverbs 25:6-7; Psalm 112; Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16; Luke 14:1, 7-14

Jesus observes guests jockeying for position at the table. He uses the opportunity to teach his hearers to choose humility rather than self-exaltation. Jesus also makes an appeal for hosts to mimic God's gracious hospitality to the poor and the broken.

<u>Sunday, 8th – 13th Sunday after Pentecost</u> – Service of Word and Prayer – God's Hands/Our Work Sunday

Texts: Deuteronomy 30:15-20; Psalm 1; Philemon 1-21; Luke 14:25-33

Jesus speaks frankly about the fearsome costs of discipleship. Those who follow him should know from the outset that completing the course of discipleship will finally mean renouncing all other allegiances.

Sunday, 15th – 14th Sunday after Pentecost –

Service of Word & Sacrament – Pastor Walter Wagner, presiding

Texts: Exodus 32:7-14; Psalm 51:1-10; 1 Timothy 1:12-17; Luke 15:1-10

Jesus tells two stories that suggest a curious connection between the lost being found and sinners repenting. God takes the initiative to find sinners, each of whom is so precious to God that his or her recovery brings joy in heaven.

<u>Sunday, 22th – 15th Sunday after Pentecost</u> – Service of Word and Prayer – Harvest Home Sunday Texts: Amos 8:4-7; Psalm 113; 1 Timothy 2:1-7; Luke 16:1-13

Jesus tells the curious story of a dishonest man who cheats his employer and then is commended by him for having acted so shrewdly. Jesus wonders why his own followers are less creative and diligent in their

stewardship given that they are managers of a far more valuable household.

Sunday, 29th - 16th Sunday after Pentecost -

Service of Word and Sacrament

Texts: Amos 6:1a, 4-7; Psalm 146; 1 Timothy 6:6-19; Luke 16:19-31*Jesus tells a parable in which the poor one is "lifted up" and the rich one is "sent away empty." Jesus makes it clear that this ethic of merciful reversal is not new but is as old as Moses and the prophets.*

October, 2019 Sunday, 6th – 17th Sunday after Pentecost –

Service of Word & Sacrament

Texts: Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4; Psalm 37:1-9; 2 Timothy 1:1-14; Luke 17:5-10

On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus instructs his followers about the power of faith and the duties of discipleship. He calls his disciples to adopt the attitude of servants whose actions are responses to their identity rather than works seeking reward.

Sunday, 13th - 18th Sunday after Pentecost -

Service of Word and Prayer

Texts: 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c; Psalm 111; 2 Timothy 2:8-15; Luke 17:11-19

Jesus' mission includes making the unclean clean again. Unexpectedly, a cleansed Samaritan leper becomes a model for those who would praise and worship God and give thanks for God's mercy.

Sunday, 20th – 19th Sunday after Pentecost –

Service of Word & Sacrament

Texts: Genesis 32:22-31; Psalm 121; 2 Timothy 3:14--4:5; Luke 18:1-8

Jesus tells a parable of a hateful judge who is worn down by a widow's pleas. Jesus is calling God's people to cry out for justice and deliverance. For if an unethical judge will ultimately grant the plea of a persistent widow, how much more will God respond to those who call.

Sunday, 27th – Reformation Sunday –

Service of Word and Sacrament

A visit from Katie and Martin Luther

Texts: Jeremiah 31:31-34; Psalm 46; Romans 3:19-28; John 8:31-36

Jesus speaks of truth and freedom as spiritual realities known through his word. He reveals the truth that sets people free from sin.

Beyond October: A WORSHIP OF TEARS, TRIUMPH, AND THANKSGIVING will be held

on All-Saints Sunday, Nov. 3. This is a time to mourn the departed, remember God's promise and give thanks for the lives of loved ones who are no longer with us. That list extends beyond close friends and family members to include all who have gone before us. Worshipers will be invited to come forward and light a small candle as a token of thanksgiving for a life remembered. By lighting the candles with light from the Christ candle, we acknowledge that the eternal lives of the saints find their source in the redeeming work of Jesus.

Visioning Teams



The process continues as the people of St Daniel's explore how God may want the congregation to respond to the needs of the world. In March and April the Transition Team hosted Small Group Discovery Meetings with follow-up meetings in June. Through these meetings the people of St Daniel's have identified actions that could be undertaken to address the issues and challenges that St Daniel's currently faces. What emerged from these efforts are six initiatives or projects that respond to where God is calling us as the congregation: (1) offering welcoming hospitality, (2) managing our financial resources wisely, (3) using our facilities efficiently, (4) enhancing our relationships when encountering change and problem-solving, (5) offering Christ-like love to our neighbors and encouraging them to participate with us, and (6) exploring possible partnerships with others to more effectively do ministry.

The Transition Team has proposed, and the Congregational Council has affirmed, the formation of Visioning Teams to explore these themes more fully and make recommendations for action. Copies listing these teams and their assignments are available in the church narthex. It is anticipated the standing committees of the church can then integrate the identified actions into the life of the congregation. Plus this information will be a valuable resource as the call committee discerns whether a candidate is a good fit for the congregation.

The dictionary defines a visionary as someone or something that thinks about the future or advancements in a **creative and imaginative way**. Within the church, a visionary is one who listens to what God is saying, explores what our community's needs are, and discusses among others how to creatively respond. The more people participating in these teams, the more fully the efforts can be developed. It is anticipated that the Visionary Teams would meet monthly during September, October, and November for one-hour sessions. Perhaps the team will decide more time is needed and continue to meet. It is proposed that the teams meet on the fourth Sunday of the month following worship (10:30-11:30 AM) but a team may find a more convenient time to meet. The first meeting is scheduled for Sunday morning, September 22.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CHURCHWIDE

ASSEMBLE held in Milwaukee on August 5

through August 9.

- Adopted a constitutional change for deacons (Rostered Ministers of Word and Service) to be ordained, rather than the previous practice of consecration.
- Adopted "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Lutheran Call to Action" condemning patriarchy and sexism and calling for action on a range of issues, including gender-based violence and workplace discrimination.
- Witnessed the presentation of the ELCA Church Council's "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent," which apologizes for the historical role of Lutherans in slavery and racism.
- Adopted the policy statement, "A Declaration of Our Inter-Religious Commitment," which will serve as church policy for inter-religious relations.
- Re-elected the Rev. Elizabeth Eaton as ELCA Presiding Bishop and electing Deacon Sue Rothmeyer as ELCA Secretary, both for sixyear terms.

• Declared the ELCA as a "sanctuary church" body.
