



Advent: What It Means



Advent is the Holy Season that precedes Christmas. It commemorates The Christ's birth and should not be confused with Christmastide. It is from the Latin term, *Adventus Redemptoris*, referring to the anticipated arrival of the Messiah. Advent usually begins on the first Sunday of December (or the last

Sunday of November, when Christmas comes before the 4th Sunday of December, as it does this year). We celebrate with candle lighting each Sunday as follows:

1st Hope—Purple Candle; 2nd Peace —Purple Candle; 3rd Joy—Pink Candle; 4th Love--Purple Candle; also the Christmas candle (white), may be lit on this Sunday or during Christmas Eve / Christmas Day worship.


