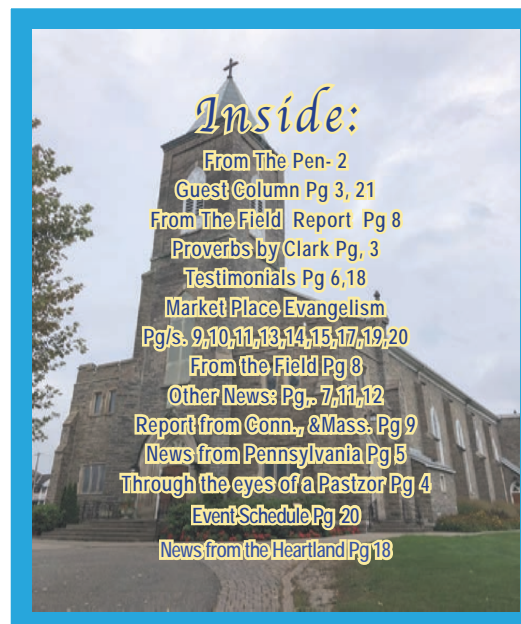

## "Healing The Feed Wagon"

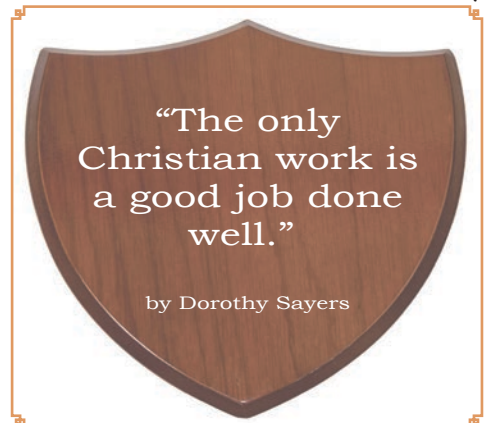
I grew up in the village of Defreestville just south of the city of Troy, New York. My dad was a farmer and the farm was primarily a dairy. In addition we grew some potatoes and, of course, hay and corn silage to feed the cows.

Since then the equipment has been used to help three relief teams perform clean up, but by far the biggest blessing came when Bill Brown's team showed up in November. When you are overwhelmed and burdened there is nothing like family coming to help and that's exactly what they did. Over the next five days we helped out several of our congregation that were still in the cleanup stage as well as finishing up sheetrock in our sanctuary so that we could get back inside. Some of our members were older and could not get out to clean up debris off of fences and it was a blessing to have another believer show up to help. One member told me, “That bunch from New York was just awesome!” and I couldn't agree more. You did it as unto the Lord and may He repay you in kind! Thank you from the heart of a Pastor.

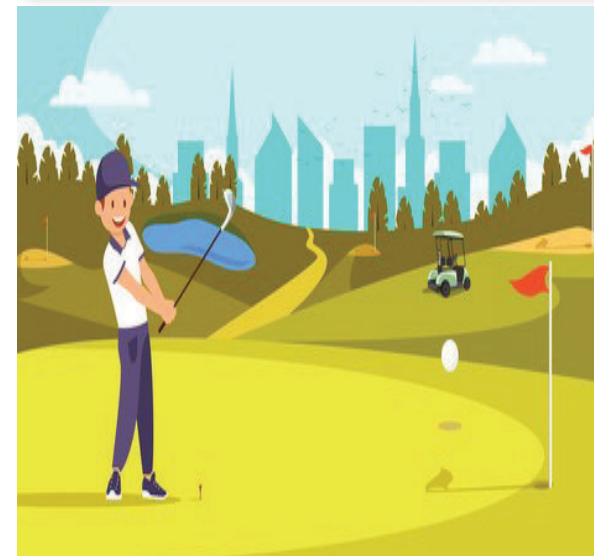

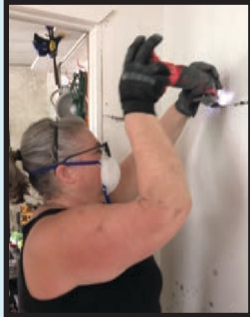

A short time ago I was talking to some young people. I kept describing for them what it means to be made new. I would ask this question of you today; what would a new you look like not on the outside but inside. I would share **2 Corinthians 5:17** about being a new creature and ask if they had toys and if they ever broke one. When I used to play with cars sometimes the wheels would bend or a part might break off. I would try to straighten those wheels on my own and I could never get them to work right again. Sometimes I think we see ourselves as unable to be repaired and so we live our lives in a broken state

Truth is, sin has caused brokenness in all of us and is a curse to man and this world. I love that Jesus has redeemed us from the curse and in him we are born again.

## “Struggling Along”

I recently texted a friend, “Whatever you’re struggling with, I am praying for the Lord’s direction.” Quickly a response said, “No struggles here?”

I on the other hand, am usually facing a few struggles. A common one for me is trying not to get distracted from one task to do another. Usually, when I start something I like to complete it. But stuff happens and the switching takes place. I have found that the struggles do bring about good lessons.

One is patience. Which reminds me of the mechanical repairs I’ve been working on an old truck.



I first must learn the procedure to take things apart, then try to reconnect them. Looking at diagrams helps direct me in that step-by-step process. I have learned to be patient through this process as it takes time and direction to do it right.

After raising two children and watching them start their own families, we were hoping to settle down to a quiet peaceful life but then our parents needed our help. They bring a different type of struggle into our lives. Since they no longer drive, they seem to have an appointment several times a week. Our schedule has a few struggles with overlapping events, so we turn to the Bible for answers, a word of encouragement, or a peaceful verse to meditate on each day. Peace which passes all understanding, allows us to function with joy through the interruptions. So even

the struggles can bring a joyful result when viewed through the right source.

What a wonderful blessing the Lord has given us. Being able to follow his direction in our struggles, teaches us patience for the next interruption. This has led to a lot less anger and anxiety for me. If life's struggles seem to be weighing on you and wearing you down, look to the Bible. The Bible has answers that will help change a negative attitude, and will bring new joy into your life.

My wife and I recently traveled several hundred miles to participate in a farm show. We learned upon arrival, we were infected with a virus. We had a total change of plans. Instead of witnessing to others, we found ourselves in isolation. We returned home when traveling was tolerable, and the event was a huge success regardless. We were saddened, but God always had something else to teach us. During this struggle I had time to write down some testimonies that were fading from my memory which normally I don’t have the time to do.

Whatever struggles plague you, know Jesus is with you patiently directing the outcome. We may not see all these possibilities until the struggles have passed, but His promises to guide us is our strength to continue. You can find this strength in plain sight, by reading the Bible as a step-by-step guide for life.

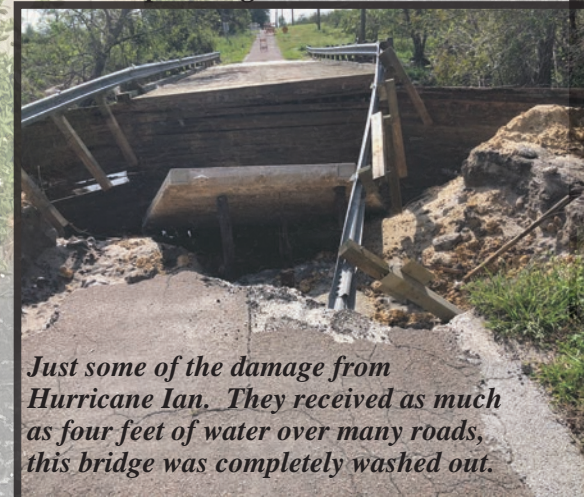
