Planning for 2020 ministry included a gathering in Abbeville, Louisiana with the Vermilion Parrish Cattlemen to remember the massive storm surge of Hurricane Rita. The surge reached Vermilion Parrish, west to Lake Charles, Louisiana and the Calcasieu Parrish. The surge salt water was three feet deep north 20 miles to I-10 and 100 miles east and west from Abbeville to Lake Charles.

The surge water stayed for a month contaminating the soil from crop production for the next two years. FCFI hauled 146 semi loads of hay and built fences on both sides of the road from Erath to Pecan Island. The Lord provided wire, posts, hay and bonded the Vermilion Parrish cattlemen in friendship with farmers who came from all over America as we built fences for over a year. Little did we know that the Lord had a reunion planned for South Louisiana—

a reunion to build more fence and ship more hay rekindling our friendship bonds through the Lord. Multiple hurricanes touched South Louisiana this past season beginning with Hurricane Laura in Lake Charles, Louisiana. Laura made landfall at Cameron, Louisiana and proceeded north through Lake Charles and on to Deridder, Louisiana. Hurricane Rita's landfall was on the Sabine River- the Texas/Louisiana border. Hurricanes Rita & Laura had parallel landfalls heavily damaging Cameron again. Page Six has photos and more news regarding the Hurricane Rita anniversary fence building. Part of the 15th Anniversary since Hurricane Rita made landfall in 2005 was getting to see our friends in South Louisiana. After Hurricane Laura's landfall in Calcasieu Parrish last September immediate disaster relief was front and center. Thankfully some of our friends sustained minor damage to their homes so they could lead disaster relief. Two of the Fellowship's South Louisiana friends included two of the men in this photo. Randy Jemison, Lake Charles, LA and Jimmy Hoppe, Fenton, LA shown left, are rice growing professionals and personal friends that committed to organize FCFI disaster relief teams with FCFI Disaster Coordinator, Mike Weaver. Joining Randy and Jimmy were Colorado wheat grower, Ivan Wiebke, and Michigan corn & soybean grower, Jamie Bush. Jamie Bush worked with and met Randy Jemison during the Hurricane Rita disaster. Jamie contacts Randy every hurricane to make sure South Louisiana is safe. Ivan stays in touch with Vermilion Parrish cattlemen. Friendship is powerful in American agriculture today. Ivan was able to contact his friends and learn how they are doing.



Calcasieu Parrish pastures were supersaturated for a long time. Fence repair had to wait to avoid excess damage to fields. South Louisiana will have long term disaster relief need. There will be fences to build in the fall of 2021. Prayfully consider organizing a South Louisiana fence building crew and contact the FCFI Home Office when you are ready.

With multiple Hurricanes hitting the Lake Charles city and the Calcasieu Parrish land, there will be a year of fixing and rebuilding dwellings. FCFI Board member, Steve Cernek shown here fourth from the left, organized a team to help people where needed. Steve's brother, John, is on the left of the photo. Greg Cormier, third from the left and his ministry partner, second from the left, both represented Operation Hope and provided the roofing materials for the project. Miss Percy was the recipient of the repaired roof. She was deeply touched by the Lord's provision of materials and workers from Wisconsin. The two remaining workers in the photo are Bill Thompson and Gene Schick.





February 28 - March 1 heavy rain flash flooded the Kentucky River where the bluegrass meets the Appalachian Mountains. This flash flooding created situations where momma cows were caught in the low lying pastures or in buildings where the animals could not escape the flood water. In many cases nothing could be done by ranchers to save the cows, bulls and calves. One of the worst experiences in American agriculture. The flooded city is Beattyville, Kentucky.

As hay from Ohio arrived local farmers unloaded the trucks so farmers could dry lot cattle preventing damage to hay ground and pastures. Much new fence needs to be built in the next six weeks. There is no such thing as a well-timed disaster. Contact the FCFI Home Office to register your disaster team to help Kentucky farm families.

FCFI President C.P. Foster and FCFI Secretary Bob Carpenter delivered a semi-load of hay to the Kentucky River Flood area. In addition, a cargo trailer of used shoes and clothing was delivered to a mission in the area. Continue to pray how your church could be involved helping folks recover from the flood damage.



Kentucky Emergency Management Agency (EMA) Representative, Jim Garrett, contacted FCFI Disaster Coordinator, Mike Weaver to enlist the Fellowship of Christian Farmers to help with Kentucky River Flood damage. Mike Weaver has coordinated several crews of fence builders and several loads of wire and posts. More wire and posts are needed. The Fellowship placed commercial ads in both the Illinois and Indiana AgriNews to let farm families know about the Kentucky River Flooding. One cattleman, Dale Ulrich from Low Point, Illinois, got the word out through his church and neighboring cattlemen. The result was a pallet of (400) new steel fence posts and one pallet of Keystone brand "Red Brand" barbed wire (27 rolls). The group also included enough electric fence wire, posts and connectors to build a half mile of portable fencing. Praise the Lord for this generous and heartfelt donation of fencing materials.

Some of the 27 rolls of barbed wire donated by a group of cattlemen in Low Point, Illinois. Another donation of woven wire and wood posts was received recently in Northern Indiana. FCFI could use your help hauling the fencing supplies to Beattyville, Indiana. Contact the FCFI Home Office for details. Thank you for your consideration of this project.
